Dear benefactors,

since 2006, we have provided necessary humanitarian aid for oppressed people through various projects that we have carried out in almost 70 countries and regions. In order to make life more comfortable for those in need, we carried out various relief measures.

We continued our projects in 2018. All water wells were built, cataract operations were carried out and many orphans were helped.

We cared for those in need in crisis regions where natural disasters such as floods, earthquakes and tsunamis made life difficult for many people.

We visited them and planned new projects.

Every month we regularly slaughtered Adaq, Aqiqa and Shukr-Qurbanis in different countries and provided a nutritious table. In addition, we have continued our charitable efforts for refugees this year.

At the opening of mosques, schools, health centres and children's playgrounds we put a smile on the faces of many needy people. A new school in Tanzania and a library for the orphans in Mongolia created a cheerful atmosphere.

We built houses for our siblings in Cambodia and Kenya as well as for the refugees from Myanmar, because they had to live under difficult conditions in the refugee camps in Bangladesh.

We are very pleased that our siblings from Myanmar can benefit from our water wells, which we have put into operation in the refugee camps in Myanmar.

Also this year we enjoyed Ramadan and Qurban with the orphans, refugees, old, lonely, sick and destitute people.

As WEFA, we will continue our activities with great motivation in 2019 and improve the lives of those who need our support.

About us




Founded in 2006, the international aid organisation WEFA works to develop empathy and solidarity in 70 countries. To this end, many social and cultural support measures are implemented. We are also working to raise people's awareness of values such as help and solidarity.

WEFA is an independent non-governmental organisation. The head office is located in Cologne and a branch office in Berlin. We help those in need who are victims of war or natural disasters, regardless of culture, nationality or origin. WEFA e.V. is a politically independent and civil society organisation providing exclusively humanitarian support.

Orphans



WEFA takes care of 4350 orphans from 20 countries. We continuously take care of their care, health, education, clothing and accommodation.



The orphans are located in Albania, Bangladesh, Benin, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Burkina Faso, Indonesia, the Philippines, Ghana, Kenya, Kashmir, Lebanon, Mongolia, Mauritania, Nepal, Pakistan, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Togo, Turkey, Yemen and Zimbabwe.





Turkey was visited in March, Tanzania in February and November and Kenya in September. We organized a dinner for the orphans and their mothers. The pocket money, which the sponsors gave to the orphans, was handed over locally. The orphans and their mothers received various gifts while food aid was provided.

WEFA Chairman Musab Aydin, who visited Sri Lanka in April, presented all the gifts to our orphans. They were given holiday clothes, school bags and stationery. In addition, food packages were handed over to orphan mothers.





In Tanzania, 400 orphans were screened

The orphans were visited in their homes.



The Mama Zaria orphanage in Kenya has been restored.





The kitchen and dining hall of the orphanage in Mongolia have been restored.

We initiated the project "Milk break for orphans" as an additional help for the orphans. The orphans who are housed in the Sargodha orphanage in Pakistan are supplied with fresh milk every morning.





The traditional 8th WEFA orphan meeting was organised in Vienna and the orphans from Bosnia and Herzegovina met their sponsored families.

















On Ramadan, a fasting break was organized for 3,070 orphans. They also received eid gifts and cloth Before Eid Al-Adha, 3,342 orphans were given eid clothes.	es.

Cataract

In 2018, we gave 2,700 people the opportunity to see unrestrained again through cataract surgery. The operations took place in Tanzania, Pakistan and Ethiopia.

A total of 13,200 cataract operations were carried out in 8 countries to help those in need.



Adaq, Aqiqa and Shukr-Qurbani

306,150 people in more than 30 countries benefited from the Adaq and Aqiqas of our donors.

The Adaq and Aqiqas of our donors have reached orphans, refugees and needy people every month.




Long-Term Projects



The construction of houses for within-refugees in Cambodia and Kenya who are struggling to survive in Bangladesh has begun. Some families have already moved into the completed houses.







The construction of the Ikra Madrasa, which began in Tanzania in February, has been completed. The official opening of the Madrasa is planned for 2019.



The extension to the Eyüp Sultan Orphanage in Tanzania was opened.



The construction of the mosque in Cotonou, the largest city in Benin, is completed. The opening was carried out with Ramadan after the first Friday prayer. A volunteer from Belgium, who took over the construction costs, cut the opening ribbon. The second floor of the mosque is used as a madrasa.



In addition to the orphanage in Mongolia, another extension will serve as a library.



The "Umut Playground" in Kenya was opened and a children's playground was built for the children in Tanzania. The children's playground, which was supported by the civil initiatives "Man is entrusted to man", "House of gratitude" and "Ensar", bears the name "Ilyas Zeyd".


The Ilyas Zeyd-Madrasa was opened in Tanzania. There are 5 classes in which the women take part in religious education in the morning and the children in the afternoon.





A health centre was opened in Tanzania. The health centre was named after Hakan Toker. He also cut off the opening ribbon.

















Eid al-Adha

To strengthen social awareness, WEFA Youth presents the project "Happiness voucher for special days". Charity donors can now give away luck vouchers on special days.










WEFA CUP 2018
